

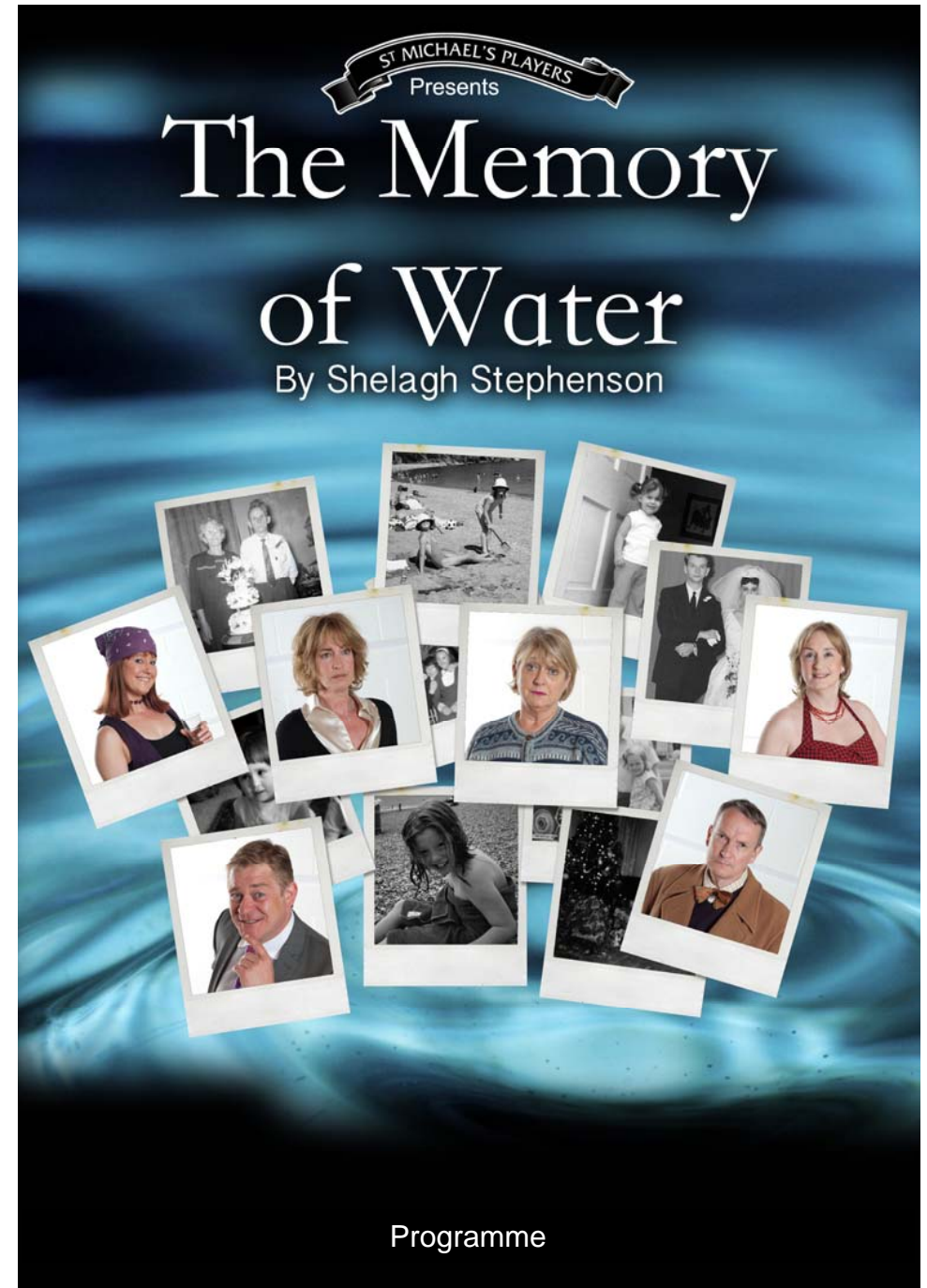
This is our first production for 2012 and we'd like to invite you all to our other shows this year:
